## The Four Who Entered *Pardes*

"Four men entered *pardes* ("the orchard" [Paradise])— Ben Azzai, Ben Zoma, *Acher* (Elisha ben Abuyah, lit. "the other"), and Akiba. Ben Azzai gazed at the Divine Presence) and died; Ben Zoma gazed and went mad; Acher destroyed the plants became an apostate); Akiba alone entered in peace and departed in peace."

Babylonian Talmud Hagigah 14b

## Merkavah (Chariot) Mysticism

- ➤ Earliest documented form of Jewish mysticism (from c. 100 B.C.E.)
- ➤ Aim: to experience a vision of the Chariot Throne of God
  - **Key Text—Ezekiel 1** (compare *Isaiah6:1-8; Exodus* 25:17-22)
  - Ascent through levels of the heavens and heavenly chambers
  - · Each level had angelic guardians
- ➤ Method: Meditation
  - Meditations on Divine Name(s)
  - "Mirror" meditation (gazing at a pool of water)
  - Often in periods of prolonged, severe fasting
  - In-body or out-of-body?
- > Restrictions:
  - Not to be taught in public—one on one initiation
  - Only by/to exemplary Torah scholars
  - Who are of a mature age (40)
- ➤ Apocalyptic parallels:
  - Daniel 7:9-10
  - Revelation 1:9-20

# Was Paul a Chariot Mystic?

## > Key text: 2 Corinthians 12:1-6

- According to Alan F. Segal, fits the pattern
- BUT—Paul described in the NT as a prophet
- Chronology:
  - 2 Corinthians written 55-56 C.E.
  - 14 years before that—after his conversion
  - Paul in Tarsus, before being brought to Antioch by Barnabas
  - Thus *cannot* be the "revelation of Jesus Christ" referred to in Galatians 1:12
- Would Paul have *continued* to practice the Chariot *after* his conversion?
- No evidence Paul ever initiated any, even of his closest disciples
- ➤ God's response to Paul's experience: 2

  Corinthians 12:7-10
- > The Clincher: Colossians 2:8-23

# TESTING THE SPIRITS

DOCTRINAL TESTS FOR DISCERNING THE SPIRITS ACCORDING TO THE APOSTLE JOHN

#### THE PERSON OF JESUS

1) Do they confess Jesus as the **MESSIAH** (**CHRIST**), Messiah as defined by the Bible? (*I John 2:22, 5:1*)

2) Do they confess the **HUMAN INCARNATION OF JESUS,** confessing that Jesus is God in human flesh? (1 John 1:1-2; 4:2)

3) Do they confess Jesus as THE SON OF GOD, MEANING, THE DEITY OF JESUS (I John 4:15, 5:5, 5:13, 5:20, 1:1)

THE GOD-MAN, THE PROMISED MESSIAH

### THE WORK OF JESUS

1) Do they confess Jesus as **THE SAVIOR OF THE WORLD**,, not "a savior," but **THE SAVIOR?**(I John 4:14)

2) Do they confess the

PROPITIATORY SACRIFICE OF CHRIST ON THE

CROSS FOR THE SINS OF THE WORLD,

meaning, do they teach that the blood sacrifice of

Jesus

on the cross, His death, is the only means by which

our sins can be forgiven and removed?

(I John 1:7-9, 2:1-2, 3:16, 4:9-10, 5:6-9)

THE LAMB OF GOD, SLAIN FOR OUR SINS

1) ARE THEY IN FELLOWSHIP (I.E., DOCTRINAL AGREEMENT AND ACTIVE PARTICIPATION)
WITH THE HISTORIC, ORTHODOX, CHRISTIAN FAITH
(WHAT THE APOSTLES TAUGHT AS THE CHRISTIAN FAITH, ACTS 2:42, EPH. 2:19-22,
THE NEW TESTAMENT)

AND WHAT CHRISTIANS EVERYWHERE HAVE BELIEVED AND TAUGHT FOR THE LAST 1960 YEARS (THE SUBSEQUENT CREEDS & COUNCILS OF THE CHURCH BASED ON THE NEW TESTAMENT)?

(I John 2:18-27, esp. 2:18-19)

2) What is the **Source** of their Message, The **"World"** and its concepts (see 1 John2:15-17) Or the **Historic, Orthodox, Christian Faith?** (1 John 4:5)

3) Who is their **Audience**, The **"World"** (Worldly People), Or the **Historic**, **Orthodox Christians who comprise the true church?** (1 John 4:5-6)
